PART III—What is the Church:

The Meaning of the Word Church

I have to confess that there was a time in my life, probably around my 18th birthday, when I oftentimes wondered how it was possible that God could accept people into His Kingdom who were from all walks of life. For instance...

- 1. How was it possible and right for some people to meet in church buildings, and others had to meet in homes.
- 2. How was it possible that so many people from all different backgrounds, cultures and religions could believe in the same God, read the same Bible, and claim to get their prayers answered?
- 3. How was it possible that some God fearing people could get behind a steering wheel, turn on the heater, and move at a high rate of speed to get to their destination, while others were born into families who drove horse and



buggies and unless they continued in that life style, they would be excommunicated, shunned and turned over to Satan by their own families and the church.

4. How was it possible that that some God fearing people were considered O-K and right with God if they were hooked up to electricity and used all kinds of power tools, while others were born could only have oil lamps, flashlights and hand tools.

I still remember so well, it happened during a time when we had a barn raising in our home community. Hundreds of people showed up to help that day-some were of

course from our community in Ashland while others had traveled in from Holmes county and Indiana.

About halfway through the day, a Holmes County Amish man walked by me and immediately, something caught my eye. It was his shirt! He wore a laid down collar and

the buttons on his shirt went all the way from the top of his shirt to the bottom. Now this really bothered me because



Ashland, we were only allowed to have three buttons and no lay down collar. I couldn't help but think of what the reaction would be from my church if I wore that man's shirt, even though he was Amish. Matter of fact, it bothered me so much that I went straight to Bishop John Brenneman and asked him about it.

Well, let's go back to our original question... how is it possible that God could accept so many people from all walks of life to come

into families who believed you into the same place? The only answer that ever made half ways good sense to me was what the following man told me one day...

> He said, "Joe—it's just like this, people from all kinds of backgrounds and belief's are walking up on different sides of the mountain of life. Some are coming up on the north side; others from the west side;



others from the south side and still others from the east side". This man went on to say, "and in the end, we all meet together at the top and that is where God then accepts us just the way we are".

I went home that day and thought to myself, that's it!!! I just need to continue on in my travels but make sure that I stay on my side of the mountain by continuing to follow the rules and doing as I had been taught by my parents and the church. And then, once I arrive at the top, God would let me in with all the other weary travelers.

Yes, that sounded perfect!!! So perfect that I thanked God for helping me understand the whole picture.

But then one day I found a scripture that brought me to a halting jolt. It was the scripture that would totally wreck the mountain idea.

Notice particularly, the little phrase in the middle — "I am the way"

Thomas saith unto him, Lord, we know not whither thou goest; and how can we know the way? Jesus saith unto him, I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me. (John 14:5-6)

Notice that Jesus did not say that He was "a" way. He very clearly pointed out that He was "The" way. Four chapters earlier, (John 10) we are told three times that Jesus is "The Door".



Just like Noah and his family had to enter through "The ONE Door" in the Ark, so we must enter through "The ONE Door" which is Jesus. Don't wait for the door to shut and the judgment of God to come. Do it now while it is called today.

We have been studying the one true church. In (part I) we learned who the builder of the church is. In Matt 16, Jesus looked at the Apostle Peter and said...

...thou art Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church; and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it. (Matt 16:18)

In (part II) we learned that Christ sent the Holy Spirit to breathe eternal life into the church, and when He did, the church became alive! Acts chapter 2 says...

And suddenly there came a sound from heaven as of a rushing mighty wind... And they were all filled with the Holy Ghost... (Ácts 2:2-4)

At this point, let's dig right into (part III) In our study today we are going learn the following truths about the Church that Christ is continuing to build at this very moment...

- 1. The Meaning of The Word "Church"

The Meaning of The Word "Church"

The dictionary defines the word "church" as "a **BUILDING** for public worship." Let's see if the word is used the same way in the New Testament.

In Acts 12:5 we are told of Peter who was in prison... but

The Pharisees used to exercise judgment and find FAULT with everyone, including Jesus. Therefore, He deals with the subject of judging and FAULT finding in the following scripture.

Matthew 7:1-2. Judge not, that ye be not judged. For with what judgment ye judge, ye shall be judged: and with what measure ve mete, it shall be measured to you again.

The Pharisees would "hunt" for someone to judge, NEVER thinking that one day God would judge them. Please note that

church unto God for him.

In Acts 15:4 we are told that when Paul and Barnabas had come to Jerusalem... they were received of the church.

In I Cor 15:9 Paul writes that he is unworthy to be called an apostle because he... persecuted the church of God.

From these three scripture passages alone we can tell that the church is not made of brick and mortar: the church is made up of believers in Christ. But wait a minute, there is some sense in which the CHURCH is a building. Jesus said in Matt 16:18 "I will build my church" and in 1st Peter 2:5, Peter describes the church as a spiritual house that is made up of lively stones (born again Christians). See also 1st Cor 3:11-17

Ye also, as lively stones, are built up a spiritual house, an holy priesthood, to offer up spiritual sacrifices, acceptable to God by Jesus Christ. (1 Peter 2:5)

Thus, the CHURCH is not a literal building, but it is a spiritual building made up of those who have been QUICKENED (MADE ALIVE) in Christ (Eph. 2:5).

In the New Testament, the word "CHURCH" always meant "AN ASSEMBLY, (A COMPA-NY OF PEOPLE GATHERED TOGETHER FOR A CERTAIN PURPOSE)" Therefore as we read



the New Testament we are not surprised to find the word "CHURCH" used with words that mean "gather together, come together, assemble together." For some examples, please read Acts 11:26; 14:27, 1st Cor 11:18; 14:23.

Now, I would like to point something out that always bothers me, when I hear it. How often have you heard someone say something to the effect of... "oh yes, that is Bishop John Yoder's church" or "I belong to the Amish church". Lest we forget who owns the church, let's read what Paul wrote.



...feed the church of God, which He hath purchased with his own blood.

(Acts 20:28)

Christ "bought" the church with His own blood. There-

prayer was made without ceasing of the fore, it is His church; He owns it and He is allowed the say-so concerning everything in the church. Leaders are but overseers, appointed by the owner (Jesus Christ), to shepherd His church.

What Were The Members of The Church Called?

1. They were called "Believers"

And believers were the more added to the Lord, multitudes both of men and women. (Acts 5:14)

2. They were called "Saints"

Unto the church of God which is at Corinth, to them that are sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be saints...

(1 Cor 1:2)

The word' "SAINT" means... a person who has been SET APART by God; SET APART for God's service.


Suppose you were sitting in the living room, during a church service, waiting to hear a very famous preacher get up and preach the next sermon. And all of a sudden the preacher walks up to the place where you are sitting, takes you by the hand, leads you to the front of the church, and sits you down right next to him! By doing that he has SET YOU APART from all the other people. He has put you in a very special place and made you **DIFFERENT** than all the other people who are there.

3. They Were Called "Brethren."

God's Word tells us that as members of the Church we are BRETHREN (brothers), one with another. Shortly after Paul (Saul) got saved, what did Ananias call him?

And Ananias went his way, and entered into the house; and putting his hands on him said, Brother Saul, the Lord... (Acts 9:17)

See (Gal. 1:2 and I Thess. 5:25-27) for more on who God calls "brethren".



If we have been **BORN-AGAIN** (John 3:3,7). Then we have all been born into same **FAMILY** and now we are all the family of God.

But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of **God**... (John 1:12)

Beloved, now are we the sons of God, and it doth not yet appear what we shall be: but we know that, when He shall appear, we shall be like Him; for we shall see Him as he is. (1 John 3:2)

As members of this special FAMILY, how many FATHERS do we have? According to the Bible we have...

One God and Father of all, who is above all, and through all, and in you all. (Eph 4:6)

How can we enter into this wonderful FAM-ILY relationship? Paul tells us in Gal 3:26.

For ye are all the children of God by faith in Christ Jesus. (Gal 3:26)

Notice again, what Gal 3:26 really says...you and I become a child of God by faith "ALONE" in Christ. Nothing more; nothing

Once when I was discussing the truth about "faith in Christ" with a 50 year old mother, she suddenly looked up and said, "and it does not say anything about the hair having to be cut a certain way, does it?" I was so glad that I could say—yes Laura, you are right. The Bible says that we become a child of God by faith in Christ + nothing!

4. They Were Called "Disciples."

And upon the first day of the week, when the disciples came together to break bread, Paul preached unto them... (Acts 20:7)



word "DISCIPLE" means "one who LEARNS, or a LEARNER. In Bible times, the disciple would oftentimes work

with his teacher, walk and travel with his teacher, eat with his teacher and spend much time with his teacher. The disciple would learn from his teacher's lips but also from his teacher's life.

For now, let's move on. Some day, it is my desire to come back and study more on what a disciple is. Maybe you would consider doing your own study on what a disciple is. If so, please share your study with me.

5. They Were Called "Christians."

...And it came to pass, that a whole year they assembled themselves with the church, and taught much people. And the disciples were called **Christians** first in Antioch. (Acts 11:26)

What name (made up of six letters) do you find in "Christian"?

Christianity is not a RELIGION (man trying to **DO** things to please GOD) but it is a RELATIONSHIP to a PERSON (who has already DONE the work necessary to save sinful men & women--as a reminder, lets look at Jesus' last three words, before he died on the cross.

When Jesus therefore had received the vinegar, he said, "It is finished": and he bowed his head, and gave up the ghost. (John 19:30)

What did He mean when He said, "it is



finished"? Answer: The penalty for sin has been paid in full! —Those who accept the payment as

paid in full, are placed in Christ through the new birth and called CHRISTians.

In Acts 11:26 we learned that "the DISCI-PLES were called CHRISTIANS first in Antioch" Who gave them this name? Does the verse say that the disciples CALLED THEM-SELVES Christians?

They did not give themselves this name, but they **WERE CALLED** "Christians" by the unsaved people who lived in Antioch. As the unsaved world looked at these disciples, they were forced to THINK about CHRIST. That is why they gave them the name "**CHRISTIANS**."

What about YOU? Can people look at your life and tell that you have a PERSONAL RELATIONSHIP with CHRIST? If for some reason you would say, well yes...

- 1. I don't swear and use God's name in vain
- 2. I wear plain clothes
- 3. I am a pretty good person
- 4. I use a horse and buggy for transportation
- 5. I have given lots of money to the poor
- 6. I am Amish
- 7. I was baptized and joined the church

...therefore unbelievers can tell that I am a Christian.

A true CHRISTIAN is a person who is able to say what Paul said in Galatians 2:20.

I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ liveth in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me. (Galatians 2:20)

Paul had a LIVING and PERSONAL relationship with the Son of God! Do you have such a relationship? Can others see CHRIST living in you?

Suppose one of your friends were to ask you this question: "What is a CHRIS-TIAN?" How would you answer that question?

Suppose someone else were to ask you, "What **religion** do you belong to?" How could you answer this person in a way that would help him (or her) to see the difference between RELIGION and CHRISTIANITY?

How can a person become a CHRISTIAN (compare Acts 26:20 with Acts 26:28)?


Think again of the word...

If you remove "CHRIST" from this word, you are left with three letters which stand for...

I am a Christian, and without Christ I am

Who Is Invited to Become a Member of the Church?



All are invited! The following verses teach us that EVERY SINGLE PERSON without exception is invited to be a member of the church that belongs to God:

Acts 10:43 "that through his name "whosoever" be-

lieveth in him shall receive remission

(forgiveness) of sins.

Acts 17:30 And the times of this ignorance God winked at; but now commandeth "all men every where" to repent:

Romans 10:11-13 For "whosoever" shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved".

Romans 1:16 "for it (the gospel of Christ) is the power of God unto salvation to "every one" that believeth"

Revelation 3:20 Behold, I stand at the door, and knock: if "any man" hear my voice, and open the door, I will come in to him, and will sup with him, and he with me.

- Do you consider yourself part of the group called "ALL MEN EVERY-WHERE" (Acts 17:30?
- Would you consider yourself a "WHOSOEVER" (Rom 10:13)?
- 3. Are you included in the group called "EVERY ONE" (Romans 1:16)?
- Would you consider yourself part of the group called "ANY MAN" (ANYONE)--Revelation 3:20?
- 5. Therefore, have YOU been INVITED to be a member of God's Church?
- 6. Have you accepted this INVITATION?
- 7. Are you SAVED and a MEMBER of His church?

Revelation 22:17 says...

And the Spirit and the bride say, Come. And let him that heareth say, Come. And let him that is athirst come. And whosoever will, let him take the water of life freely.

As you compare Romans 3:22 with Romans 10:12—(the next two scriptures) you will discover that the same phrase (made up of 5 words) is found in each of these verses. What are they?

Romans 3:22 Even the righteousness of God which is by faith of Jesus Christ unto all and upon all them that believe: for there is no difference:

Romans 10:12 For there is no difference between the Jew and the Greek: for the same Lord over all is rich unto all that call upon him.

Simple Thoughts From Eli

Hay-Ropes, Ice and Faith

When I was young and growing up, we had one of those large old barns, with four haymows. When we put loose hay in the back mows, we children often had the job of



pulling back the carriage to the center for the next load. My older cousins who happened to be helping with hay showed us that you could ride the rope down from the crosstie.

That looked risky, so we would climb half-way up and try that first. When we came to the point where we believed that was safe, we would climb higher and grab the rope for a ride down. I began to have faith in that rope. And to gain faith, I had to become familiar with the object—in this case the rope.



We also used to skate in the winter. First we had to find ice that would bear our weight. If we put our trust in thin

ice, we soon found out that what is really needed is thick ice. If I say I have strong faith in weak ice, I'll soon need rescuing. If I have weak faith in strong ice, I need to build a stronger faith in the ice; I need to know what the ice will hold before I trust my life on it. It also helps to know how deep the water is, under the ice. In other words, know your ice. I can say, I hope the ice will hold, but that is not faith. Test the ice, drill a hole through it or ask someone who knows. When the evidence is there, then I'll move on it. In this case the ice is the object of my faith and trust. The proof

of my faith is when I begin to skate on it.

Hebrews 11:1 says; "Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen."

Just as we are careful before we place our confidence in hay ropes, or ice, we also choose carefully what we believe in matters concerning our soul. Will it hold? Of course I can see a rope, but what about the unseen things? That's where we need some help.

Romans 10:17 So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God.

We have to become familiar with the object of our faith, Jesus Christ. To do that, we have to study what the Bible (Word of God) says.

Matthew 3:16-17 says And Jesus, when



he was baptized, went up straightway out of the water: and, lo, the heavens

were opened unto him, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove, and lighting upon him: And lo a voice from heaven, saying, This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased.

Here is one witness as to who Jesus really is. A voice spoke from heaven. Is there more, you ask? Let's take a look at Matthew 9:6.

Matthew 9:6 says, But that ye may know that the Son of man hath power on earth to forgive sins, (then saith he to the sick of the palsy,) Arise, take up thy bed, and go unto thine house.

The reason for this healing was to give us confidence that Jesus was indeed able to



forgive sins.

evidence. There
an many different places in the
Bible where you
will find more

pieces of evidence that build faith. Also, ask other people that have already built their faith according to scripture.

I know that in everyday life, I cannot forgive a debt that is owed to uncle Henry. Since the debt is owed to him, he is the only person with the authority to forgive. Anything else is fraud. That is why we have to establish that Jesus Christ has the authority to forgive sins. Is He indeed the Son of God? Yes, you say, but is he willing?

John 3:16 says; For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life.

The word 'whosever' means anybody. Let someone who is very wealthy write a check and put on the 'pay to the order' of line the word 'whosoever'. The bank will have you endorse it and you get your money. The bank believes that you are 'whosoever'. If I didn't believe it was real, I wouldn't even take it to the bank.

John 6:37 All that the Father giveth me shall come to me; and him that cometh to me I will in no wise cast out.

That tells me if I approach Jesus seeking forgiveness and redemption, I will not be turned away. There is much more to base our faith and trust upon, but that's a start.





Amazing Facts In The Bible

- The Bible tells about a time when the **sun actually stood still in the sky** for about one day. (Joshua 10:13)
- 2. Another time, the **sun went backwards** in the sky. (Isaiah 38:8)
- 3. There have been two men in the Bible who **never died**, but went to be with God. (Genesis 5:24; 2 Kings 2:11)

Does the Bible really claim that the Flood covered the ENTIRE Earth?

- All The Mountains Were Covered. The tops of all the high mountains under the entire heavens were at least 20 feet beneath the waters surface (Genesis 7:19-20). In addition, the waters remained at this awesome, mountain-covering height for five months! (Genesis 7:18-24, 8:1-5).
- The Ark Was Huge. The ark was necessary to prevent the extinction of humans and animals. If the Flood were merely local, God could have sent them to a safer part of the world.
- 3. **Humans Populated The Entire World.** After more than 1600 years of habitation on Earth, the planet's population was surely large (millions or billions). The Bible confirms that (a) Man had multiplied upon the face of the Earth (Genesis 6:1), (b) Violence and corruption filled the Earth (Genesis 6:11-12).
- 4. All Humans Were Killed. The Bible clearly teaches that all flesh died...every man (Genesis 7:21). Genesis 9:1 confirms that only Noah's family was saved and that every person living today is descended from his family.
- 5. **All Air-Breathing, Land Animals Killed.** The world's entire population of air-breathing, land animals died, except those taken into the ark (Genesis 7:21) "everything on Earth" (Genesis 6:17) "all living creatures of every kind on the Earth" (Genesis 9:16).
- 6. God's Rainbow Promise. God promised never again to send a global flood (Genesis 8:21, 9:8-17). This promise is demonstrated by the symbol of the rainbow, a sign for God's promise to all the Earth. The rainbow is a sign to every living creature, mankind and animals. If this promise was not made to all creatures on Earth, then God has broken His promise. Local floods have repeatedly killed hundreds and even thousands of humans and animals since Noah's time.
- 7. Why Stay In The Ark A Year?! Noah was in the ark for more than a year, not just 40 days (Genesis 8:14). 53 weeks is absurdly long to stay in the ark for a local flood since dry land would have been just over the horizon. After the flood waters had been going down for 4 months, the dove could still find no suitable ground (Genesis 8:9). This does not seem to fit the circumstances for a local flood in which the dove could fly to dry land. However, these situations are consistent if the Flood was global.
- 8. **The Whole Earth Was Devastated.** God said, "behold, I will destroy them with the earth" (Genesis 6:13b). The global extent of the Flood is referred to more than 30 times in Genesis 6-9 alone! In Isaiah 54:9, God states, "I have sworn that the waters of Noah should no more go over the earth." Peter delivered a clear global warning, confirming that God created the Earth, devastated it by the Flood, and will one day destroy it again by fire (2 Peter 3:5-7). Peter certainly did not mean that just a local area on Earth would be burned. Just as the Flood was global, so will be the final judgment.

It's Hard to Be a Leader, If You Are Addicted to Anger?

(James 3:7-8) For every kind of beasts, and of birds, and of serpents, and of things in the sea, is tamed, and hath been tamed of mankind: But the tongue can no man tame; it is an unruly evil, full of deadly poison.



Anyone can become angry. That is easy. But to be angry with the right person, to the right degree, at the right time, for the right purpose and in the right way — that is not easy.

Anger can eat a person up.

People who explode and express anger easily can cause great harm to those they are

called to encourage. It's important for us to understand anger and it's ability to destroy.

Exploding because someone hurt you. When most people get hurt, they cry out. This is natural. But it is not healthy to express anger, every time someone hurts your feelings.

A good leader has the ability to harness his anger and even shift it toward healthy and more productive areas. Mistreating someone because they hurt you is not just. It is bullying.

It is entirely possible that the person who hurt you did it unintentionally and without meanness. You would be wise to forgive them quickly and swallow that anger before you create a split in a relationship that cannot be mended.

Being addicted to anger. Some people love to be angry. They enjoy the feeling of power they get when they have told someone off. They actually look for opportunities to get after someone or give someone a hard time.

These people are addicted to the emotion of anger and have no place in any type of leadership. It is important to be a person of peace. If you find yourself constantly getting angry at others for little reasons, you might be addicted to anger. Just like any other addict, you can actually build up patience for this drug. Once this happens, you will find it necessary to constantly become angrier in order to get the same excitement. This could end in a terrible way if you do not get deliverance from this addiction.

Using anger to get your way. Most people learn to get what they want through anger, at a very early age. Babies learn quickly to cry out in anger when they are not getting what they want. They will use anger tantrums to control their parents who simply want to quiet them down.

These same people grow up believing that they can use anger to get their way all the time. On the job, they will use anger to cause others to cave into their demands. These people may not stomp their feet in the workplace, but you know when they are mad and they will use this to control others.

Who anger hurts. Anger usually hurts those closest to you. Family, friends, and close age groups are usually hurt by people given to anger. People outside your circle of influence will find humor in your outbursts, but those close to you will be damaged as they are usually the target of your outbursts of anger. Anger is a stronghold that you can be delivered from. It's power to hurt and damage must be controlled if you are going to be an encourager to those already beaten down by this world.

When Hurt By Someone Close To You

Recently, I was deeply hurt by someone close to me: My immediate reaction was

anger. Then grief. Then disappointment. And then wounded pride. I had expected so much more in the relationship! And because I hate pain, I wanted to:

(1) Run from it (2) Criticize the person inflicting the pain (3) Pout – Have a pity party!

In other words, do anything to get rid of the pain.

Such reactions are not condoned in Scriptures. Rather, we are to respond with:

Compassion (Matthew 9:13, 36; Mark 1:41; Luke 6:36; Ephesians 4:32; 1 Peter 3:8)

Kindness (Proverbs 14:21; Matthew 5:42; Luke 6:34, 35; 1 Corinthians 13:4; 2 Peter 1:7)

Humility (Isaiah 57:15; 66:2; Matthew 5:3)

Patience (2 Tim 3:10; 4:2; Eph 4:2; Col 1:11)

Gentleness (James 3:13; Titus 3:2; 1 Thessalonians 2:7; 1 Timothy 6:11; Ephesians 4:2; 2 Corinthians 10:1)

And we are to:

- 1. Bear (literally, endure) the pain inflicted upon us.
- 2. Forgive the person even when they keep sticking it to us:

And if he trespass against thee seven times in a day, and seven times in a day turn again to thee, saying, I repent; thou shalt forgive him. (Luke 17:4)

Here's how the Apostle Paul put it:


Put on therefore, as the elect of God, holy and beloved, bowels of mercies, kindness, humbleness of mind, meekness, longsuffering; Forbearing one another, and forgiving one another, if any man have a quarrel against any: even as Christ forgave you, so also do ye. (Colossians 3:12-13)

For example, Jesus, in his dying breath uttered ... "Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do." (Luke 23:24).

And Stephen, as they were crushing in his skull with rocks whispered, "Lord, lay not this sin to their charge." (Acts 7:60b)

We all know brittle, sour prune-types that stink with anger and bitterness. And that's where we are headed unless we embrace the spirit of Jesus and Stephen. So let's make a decision today: That by His grace we will allow no one to ruin our life. And we will accomplish this unmatched act by choosing to be the very picture of compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, patience, forbearance and forgiveness.




Jesus said it plain in John 14:6...






In 2006, Diane was accused of practicing medicine and midwifery without a license. But as you can imagine, the action drew pro-

What You'll Need: Two hands, two eyes.



Retaliation costly for Amish youth in **Cattaraugus County, NY**
