Each apartment will come with a small kitchen and dining area, living room, bathroom, and one bedroom. In addition to three apartments, we are also planning on adding a small laundry and conference room. A doorway will be added between two apartments, in case a family needs help—similar to what you see in some motels.

Is there room and opportunity left for you to join others in this ministry project? The answer is We ves. are looking for individuals, families, and churches to help us furnish each apartment. If this is an area of interest, please let us know. If you choose to furnish apartment, we would like to have some fun and let you name the apartment.

There's something else I would like to share with you. As you know, those who come to MAP for help have little or no money to support themselves. They often need a birth record, Social Security number, and a job. This process can sometimes take six months to a year. For that reason, we are looking at building a bulk food store on the same grounds. This would do three things for the housing ministry: 1. Provide immediate iobs. 2. Keep individuals occupied, 3. Generate income to pay for the housing ministry. We would love for you to pray and offer input. If the Lord leads you to give toward this project, let us know.

Bible Club

Last year, we focused on gaining new students, and 8,560 new names were sent to us. This year, we have put a program in place that challenges each student to stay faithful and committed. Many thanks to *In His Steps Foundation* for giving MAP a grant to help with this program. Please pray that the gospel would not be hindered and that many would surrender their lives to Jesus Christ. Last year, about 200 students sent in testimonies of coming to Christ. Hallelujah and glory to God!

Miscellaneous

During 2015, we spoke in twenty four churches and did one 3-day *Amish Awareness Conference*. This year we have eleven churches and one 2-day conference on the schedule.

The Amish Voice publication is a very important ministry that continues to be at the top of our list. Some ask to be removed and others ask to be added. It is a bittersweet ministry to older Amish adults and families.

My goal is to continue the ministry of


mentoring and discipleship.

Yoder Update

Dear Friends and Supporters, 2015 was another bountiful year for the kingdom of God. The fields are truly white unto harvest as we have seen close to 1,000 people come to know Jesus as their Savior through prison, Job Corps, and community ministry.

I have recently been more involved in ministry at Job Corps, preaching on Sunday mornings and having Tuesday night Bible studies. It has been a great experience for me personally, reaching out to young folks (ages 17-24) and seeing them come to know Jesus as their Savior and growing in the Lord. This past Sunday I had a young girl from Africa, a young man from Haiti, and several foreigners from other countries in one service! I'm amazed that I can do international missions right here locally!

I have been able to involve more former Amish and Mennonite individuals with ministry. One father/son team has been leading classes one night a week at a local jail for close to a year. It has blessed them so much that they are now considering other ways in which they can become more involved.

We have had a young former Amish man in our apartment now for over a year as we help him get acclimated to life outside the community. He came from a very sheltered situation, so it has been a struggle for him to learn how to function in a new world. He has come a long way, though, and is currently trying to find a small piece of property that he can afford, so that he can be on his own.

I have also been able to develop several new relationships with the local Amish and Mennonite communities by offering taxi service. During a recent taxi trip, we had great Bible conversations.

2015 Goals

Here are some goals I set for myself last year. Some of them, I'm afraid, fell by the way of most New Year resolutions!

1. Start a weekly Bible study/discipleship program in our local Amish and Mennonite community.

Although I never did get a regular Bible study started like I was hoping, I feel like I'm closer to seeing it as a possibility through some of the relationships I have been able to develop.

2. Work on my own personal development through more personal Bible study and also by reading a book called, When Helping Hurts, so that I may become better equipped to help those who are struggling to deal with life.

This is, for the most part, a goal we never get fully accomplished and I haven't gotten as far with it as I thought I would. I got side-tracked on finishing the book, but have had several experiences in the past year that have helped me understand the basic principles of the book.

3. Share my testimony with churches to raise awareness of the need to share the Gospel with Amish and Mennonite people.

I was able to share with approximately one church a month on this subject, sometimes sharing the PowerPoint, and other times just sharing my testimony.

2016 Goals

1. I'm excited about the **2016 Amish Awareness Conference** we have planned for April 22-23. This 2-day conference will take place in Eddyville, Ky, which is within an hour of a greater portion of Kentucky's Amish population! Also, we will be offering this conference at no charge to you other than your motel

Girod Update

First of all, I want to thank God for what was accomplished in 2015. We had the opportunity to be part of the *Amish Awareness Conference*. Even though I taught one of the sessions, it wasn't until we were on our way home that I began to realize: God wants me to become part of MAP Ministry. I called Joe right away and told him and we prayed about it. A couple weeks later, we filled out our applications to become part of MAP. We were approved on October 23, 2015, and attended three days of MAP Ministry training in November. It was very rewarding and prepared us for going out and presenting the ministry at local churches in the United States.

I recently had the opportunity to answer some of the questions posted on the MAP website. There was a Muslim student from Morocco who wanted to interview a former Amish person. We set up a Skype session and I was asked about 10 questions. I made sure to tell them who saved me and I was able to share the gospel!

This past Thanksgiving, we took a trip to Clare, Michigan,



where we visited Polly's aunt, uncle, and family. They live in a community where they are like New Order Amish and can either have cars or horse and buggy. They

believe you are saved by grace through faith, and we had a great time of fellowship in the Lord. They asked us to come and present the ministry in 2016, so we're looking forward to that.

On the way home, we stopped in Homer, MI, where Polly used to live. There is another Amish family living at her former home now, but we had a great visit with the family. The husband is a minister in their church and they gave us a tour of the whole house.

From there we drove south to a settlement in Branch



County, MI. My mother's parents and most of her siblings live in that area. There are about 450 descendants from my grandparents alone. As far as I can tell, I'm the only one with a salvation testimony. I had not seen my grandparents since 2011, and we had a great visit with them.

While we were in that area, we stopped in two different churches, gave them our cards, explained about MAP Ministry, and told them how there is a great need for the gospel to reach the Amish people. My heart cries out for that area because I am related to many of them. I don't know of any that have a salvation testimony.

Goals for 2016

- 1. Get more grounded in the word of God and continue to have devotions and study the word of God every morning with my wife, Polly—and also work on my own personal development!!
- 2. Continue to go to Bible College here at home every Tuesday night and get through 10 courses!
- 3. Present MAP in 15 different churches this year and raise enough funds to send lessons out to 60 more students per month. It costs \$30 a child per year to send out lessons!
