I want to personally thank you for your support and prayers for the ministry since our last update.

We finally closed on the property right beside where we live. It has an old church house on it, part of which we plan to convert into an apartment for those who leave the Amish and need a place to stay.

In 2017, you helped us mail over 95,000 Bible lessons to Amish homes. Because of your generous giving and tens of thousands of volunteer hours, 297 students surrendered their lives to Jesus Christ! Over 48,000 copies of the Amish Voice were mailed out to Amish families. Joe and Esther Keim shared and updated the ministry at 24 churches in the US. Because of you, MAP continues the Bible Club, Plowman's Academy, GED classes, Bible studies, and Amish Voice mailings. Because of you, MAP reached out to Rosie, who needed a job, a place to live, and emotional and

spiritual support—she had left the Amish once before and fell into drugs and alcohol. We were able to help Barbara, Christian, Johnnie, Sally, Nelson, Lizzie, and about 75 others in 2017. Some struggled with alcohol, incest, marriage problems, and mental illnesses; others got out of prison and had nowhere to go. Together, with God's help and your faithful support, we met every single need. Not one was turned away. All heard about Jesus and His great salvation. Thank you, my dear friend! You are making a huge difference every day. Let's do it again in 2018!

After moving to ten different places, Sarah ended up in a women's shelter. During her process of moving and trying to find help, an individual took advantage of Sarah and left her with a sexual and painful condition.

In time, someone connected Sarah with our ministry. Friends of MAP took Sarah in, gave her a place to stay, and connected her with a doctor who would help her get rid of her health condition. The ministry helped Sarah get a job and provided counseling.



Changed Lives in 2017: Annie, Rosie, and Sarah

My mother, Fannie Blake, volunteered with MAP Ministry for a long time. When she reached the age of 94, we felt she needed someone to stay with her, so we hired Annie, a former Amish girl. We adopted her into our very large family. She was Mom's caregiver for two years, until her health declined and she was taken to a senior care and retirement center to live.

It was there that my mom became friends with a lady named America. Mom told her about MAP Ministry and how Annie had been her caretaker at home. America told Mom that she wanted one of those girls to help her when she returned to her home.

Mom passed away, and America was lost without her. She told me to keep talking to Joe Keim. She wanted one of those girls to help her. When America returned to her home, there wasn't anyone available to help, so her daughters filled in the gaps.

One day, Joe got a call from a girl in Kentucky named Rosie (not her real name). She planned to leave Kentucky that night and would be able to help America. We worked together to get everything ready for her arrival.

Rosie arrived to a warm meal and greetings from America and her family. They had even bought a small cake with the inscription, "Welcome, Rosie." For the next several days, America's family took Rosie to buy new clothes, shoes, a coat, and other things necessary for Ohio weather.

Rosie had been adopted by an Amish family, so she already had a Social Security card. America's family helped Rosie open a checking account and talked about her getting her GED and learning how to drive. They showed her all that could be made available to her.

Unlike many Amish, Rosie was very talkative and eager to answer questions. She'd had a cellphone since she was fifteen, which she had hid from her parents. She was very much into the modern world and knew about many movies, actors, etc. She had talked to numerous men online, which was pretty scary to me. We talked about this and warned her that all of this was not good.

I took her to church. She attended the former Amish Sunday school class and was welcomed by everyone. She was even given a new Bible. I then met her for the main church service. She watched, listened, and sang the songs. On the way home, Rosie said that she had really enjoyed it.

One day, she asked if she could have a boy come to the house. Ervin and three other friends had traveled to Ohio so they could meet girls with whom they were corresponding. Ervin had been corresponding with Rosie, so he decided to meet her.

Ervin arrived. He was very tall, former Amish, and was a clean-cut young man wearing a cowboy hat and boots. He introduced himself, chatted for a while, and then they went into another room. That night, Ervin's friends failed to pick him up—they had fallen asleep in their Sometime after midnight, Joe Keim received a call from Rosie asking if he could swing by and pick Ervin up. That night, Ervin stayed with the Keims while the three friends slept in freezingtemperature weather.

The following night, at about 2:30 a.m., Rosie secretly packed her belongings and disappeared. She took all of the new clothes that the family had given her, and she left a note on the bathroom mirror written in lipstick, thanking America's family and apologizing that she Continued had to leave.
