Joe, continued

For the last six months, Esther and I have met with Joe and Emma on a regular basis.

We have studied everything from what God expects of us, assurance of salvation, the Bible, the church, daily walk, baby Victoria entered the world.

Evangelism is a gift. Teaching is the enemy, and family—to a gift (Eph. 4:11). Discipleship is being at the hospital when not a gift, but rather a command for all believers (Mt. 28:18-20).

Year in Review: 2018 will be remembered as the year of many long days and short nights. Not only did we open the doors to Beyond Measure Market and New Beginnings Homestead, but Esther and I spoke in twenty-seven churches, colleges, and conferences. In 2018, Tina and the volunteers broke all records by mailing out 104,551 Bible lessons to Amish children and adults; according to responses in the mail, 358 students surrendered their lives to Jesus Christ. Five individuals moved into our home basement and allowed us to help them physically, emotionally, and spiritually. An additional six women moved into our New Beginnings apartments.

Two young women served as interns at MAP. Miranda, who lives in the Netherlands, is filling out her paperwork and plans on coming back to serve a longer term. Stephanie, who just finished her three months with MAP, is (at some point) moving to the Lancaster, Pennsylvania, area to start her own ministry to the Amish. In all, we helped about thirty people with birth certificates, Social Security numbers, and jobs. Thirty-five students graduated from our GED classes.

The Amish Voice continued to go out every other month to about 9,000 Amish people. We continue to meet together every week to pray for the Amish and former Amish. About 100 students continued their studies in our Plowman's Academy, a Bible study correspondence ministry run under the leadership of Paul Miller.

While hundreds of people prayed and volunteered their time at MAP, more than 80 churches and 350 individuals stood in the gap financially.

What did I learn from all this? I learned and was reminded again and again that God has brought some of His greatest and most awesome warriors to come alongside MAP. You, our most precious warriors, stood with us on the front lines and refused to give in, even when the battle was most severe. You believed in us when we struggled to believe in ourselves. You are the backbone of MAP. Thank you! Soon you will receive your great and eternal reward.

As we enter 2019, I invite you to continue your journey with us. Tens of thousands of Amish people are wandering this earth, spiritually blinded, caught up in a man-made religion and about to stumble into eternity without Christ. —Joe and Esther Keim

Saloma heard of us and our story through Samuel, continued some friends, and she also watched our episode on the documentary Breaking the Silence. Her story is much like Polly's.

As for our 2019 goals, we hope to enlarge our living room and kitchen and add more bedrooms to our house, and we need to make room for baby #6, who is due in the middle of summer. We would also like to pick up support from more churches in 2019 and continue to do Bible college.

Please continue to pray for the young women. Pray for salvation for those who are not saved, as




well as for continued growth for those who are saved. I, too, covet your prayers for wisdom and guidance as I minister to and live life with these young ladies. -Velda Miller

Interning at MAP for God

From a young age, I knew that I was to be a missionary. I grew up in a pastor's home and got to visit with missionaries in a way that not many people did. This sparked an interest in missions within me that has lasted throughout the years.

When I was around sixteen, I began to feel a burden for the Amish people. I had grown up around them in central Pennsylvania for several years, so I knew a little about them. During my time there, I realized that they needed a Savior just as much as I did, as many of them were just

trying to work their way into heaven. When I first felt the burden for the Amish, I thought it was just some passing thought, but over the years it has grown and has never left.

In the spring of 2018, I joined Hope International Missions, and through them I got in touch with MAP. They set up a time for an internship to learn more about the culture and what ministries are needed for work among the Amish.

I have been grateful for my time at MAP. Although I knew a lot about the Amish, seeing it from this perspective has been even more eye-opening to how much the Amish need the gospel. I have also realized that I may need to learn the basics of counseling so that I will be equipped to help people with the first stages of getting help. There are many

needs that the Amish have that are unknown to the common outsider. My time at MAP has helped to show me what some of them are. With the Lord's help, I will do my best to meet the ones that I can.

God has begun to open doors for future ministry. January and February will be months of preparation for my next phase of ministry. After that, I plan to move to Pennsylvania where I will work with the Amish through a local congregation.
