

Joe Keim Update

Dear Friend:

There are many different types of Amish people. Some communities are ultra conservative and live under a long list of man-made rules. These communities are very religious, ridged and harsh. Alcohol and other addictions, sexual abuse and depression run rampant. Adult education is at a 5th grade level. But then there are those communities who are more open to the gospel, and in some instances, preach that salvation is a gift from God and cannot be earned.

At the end of 2019, an Amish preacher from an ultra conservative community surrendered his life to Christ. A short while later, he came home to find his wife and 9 children missing. His wife, fearing

her husband's direction in life, chose to go into hiding. The youngest child was 2-1/2 weeks old.

Three weeks went by with no sign of his family. The community declined to share details. Perry went from wanting to get the law involved, to patiently waiting on God, to thoughts of suicide.

While many of us came around Perry and held him up in prayer and support, he traveled the backroads, looking for signs of his family. One day, at the end of January, he spotted a small familiar piece of clothing hanging on a clothesline—he had found his wife and children.


We urge you to pray for Perry and his

family. He desires for his wife and children to understand salvation and be saved. At the time of this writing, Perry has fully surrendered his life to the leadership of his community and his wife. The community is pressuring the couple to get Amish-style counseling, which is not much counseling at all.

In the meantime, Samuel Girod is working on setting up an Amish Awareness Conference in the area of this 1,500 family community; a community where it seems sexual abuse, alcohol and addictions are rampant and nearly out of control. We ask that you pray fervently.



Thank you for your continued prayers and support. It's been almost a month since Joanna went to be with Jesus.

Our daughters, Joanna and Loretta, were born with a disease called Mucolipidosis Type II (I-cell disease). Any type of respiratory sickness will weaken their immune system. Our family got sick around Christmas for two days with an upper respiratory infection and fevers. Joanna just couldn't pull out of it, even with medication.

If it wasn't for God's grace, we couldn't do it on our own. We rejoice that Joanna is in much better care than we could ever give her. On one hand, we look forward to seeing her again because of what our Savior did on the cross for you and I, and on the other hand, I miss her so much that I can still feel her skin when I would put my face in her neck and kiss her, and still feel her hair, and still feel how her skin felt on her hands and feet. I-cell children have a unique smell that I'll never forget. Almost every day, I would come home from work and pick her up. She expected that! Some days I would walk by her, and

she would reach her arms up at me until I picked her up! Yes, I miss all that!

Not a day goes by that I wonder what she is doing right now with Jesus. We knew when Joanna was born that she would have a short life, but it still doesn't make it any better losing her. Instead of being mad at God, I know in my heart that He has a greater purpose, and I simply just trust and believe.

We, as a Family, are doing better than expected. The day after Joanna's funeral, Loretta spent 2 days in the hospital. She was dehydrated and lethargic. She didn't want to eat or drink, but after a couple of days she began eating more, and is now back to her normal playing and eating.
