My name is Eli Hostetler. I was raised in a strict Swartzentruber Amish home, and my dad was a very conservative bishop, so I was taught that in order to have a chance of getting to heaven, I had to be Amish and follow all the traditions. For that reason, I grew up thinking of God as a stern man who was very hard to please.

When I was fourteen years old, my oldest brother, who was no longer Amish, shared some biblical truths with me. At this time in my life, I thought there was no way I could stay Amish, but then I talked to my dad, and he said that if I left the Amish, he had no hope that I'd ever have a chance of going to heaven. His words placed a fear in me, and he convinced me to stay Amish.

I thought I would understand the Amish ways better with time, so when I was eighteen, I became a member of the Amish church. As time went on, instead of understanding things better, the Amish church and beliefs made less and less sense to me.

On April 15, 2015, I married Barbara Gingerich. Then in the fall of 2017, I realized that I had to establish who I was and what I stood for, so I started searching the Scriptures for answers. One verse that I really liked was Galatians 3:28: *There is neither*



Jew nor Greek, there is neither bond nor free, there is neither male nor female: for ye are all one in Christ Jesus.

In February of 2018, I gave my life to Jesus Christ, and shortly after that, my wife and I left the Amish and our family to follow Christ.

During the past couple of months, I started thinking and reading more about the topic of baptism. For that reason, it was my desire to be baptized as a believer in our Savior, Jesus Christ.
