Legacy Wall and CommUnity Crusade

We're excited to announce that we are in the final stages of building our New Beginnings Homestead. After hanging a few pieces of trim and a couple doors in the basements of Apartments B and C, we will be ready to close this chapter!

Looking back, the most amazing part about this journey has been seeing God provide for the cost of the apartment building in full! Together we raised almost \$400,000! Thank you!

As a reminder of all the sacrifice, time, and labor that went into building these apartments, we have created a plaque that lists all the names of people who were involved in making it happen. If you ever get a chance to come and visit, we would love to show you our "Legacy Wall," made from beautiful oak and filled with gold-plated name tags. It hangs in the New Beginnings Community Room for all to see so we will be continually reminded of you, God's people, and your sacrifice and outpouring of love to make a difference in our generation.

Since opening the doors on September 1, 2018, nine women from six different states have lived in or are currently living in our New Beginnings apartments.

On another note, God is stirring hearts in many different Amish communities. One of those communities is Middlefield, Ohio,

where both young and old are surrendering their hearts to Christ and following the Lord in baptism. In one case, an Amish husband got saved and got baptized by immersion; as a result, family and church members removed his wife from her home, fearing she would follow in her husband's footsteps.

In addition, many Amish churches in Ohio,

Pennsylvania, and northern Indiana are threatening and banning members from family fellowship and

community— simply because they got saved and are attending Bible studies.

An Amish bishop recently asked a member, "What can we do to keep our people from leaving the Amish?" The member replied, "Take their English Bibles away and force them to stick with the old German transcript, and you will keep them."

Unfortunately, these kinds of situations are not uncommon. We have been seeing more and more of it happening. I'm often reminded of the immense grip that traditions and man-made rules have on a culture; they overpower the grace and simplicity of the gospel and freedom in Jesus Christ.

Beginning June 5, we are having another CommUnity Crusade in the Middlefield, Ohio, area. There will be nonstop worship, prayer, and preaching—24 hours a day—for four days. You are welcome to join us; we are expecting God to move mightily!
