

From Canadian-Amish to Christian —by Rachel Stutzman

Rachel grew up in an Canadian-Amish household and made the decision to leave the Amish lifestyle earlier this year. On May 27, 2022, as many of you prayed, Rachel crossed the border into the United States. She is currently working on permission to stay in the states with the hopes of eventually becoming a US citizen. MAP has been assisting Rachel by helping her gather the needed documents and also by providing employment for her once she gets approved. Following is her testimony:

I have good, fun memories of growing up Amish with my twin sister. I enjoyed working at home and having fun with my siblings. I have fond memories of going out for some fun with my sisters and friends, or just simply sitting down and talking the afternoon away!

As I grew older, life lost its fun and intrigue. I was glad to leave my naughty young days behind, but I started to see that living life as Amish was not the only life I could live. The decision to leave the Amish was more difficult than actually leaving. My twin was the only person that knew I was leaving. Though she didn't feel good about me leaving, she didn't say much to me about it, and she kept my secret. I left a note for my parents telling them that I didn't want to be baptized in the Amish church.

Growing up, I thought of God as a kind, powerful, and creative man. As I got to know Jonathan, he talked about God and helped me see my need to receive God.

On the evening of August 2, 2022, as Joe Keim opened his Bible app on his phone and explained verses, I understood what it meant to be saved. I made the decision to receive Christ. A verse that stood out to me was Romans 10:13 – *“For whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved.”*

I had always thought that I would be baptized someday, but now I understand baptism does not help a person get to heaven.

As a Christian, I hope to serve God and make every day bright while I enjoy all His creation.
